***New* Bass Clarinet Workshop with Sarah Watts.** The workshop is open to bass clarinet players of all ages and levels (amateur and professional) and also to anybody who is curious or interested in bass clarinet. The session will be 90 minutes long. Come and pick up some technique tips in a group warm up session. This will be followed by a short ensemble session playing through some accessible fun works. There will also be an opportunity to answer questions. To conclude Sarah will perform a short 20 minute recital at the end of the session.

Dr Watts specialises in low clarinets and has gained an international reputation as an artist, teacher and researcher. She has performed and taken masterclasses at universities and conservatoires in the UK, Ireland, Asia, Europe and the Americas. Sarah's PhD was on bass clarinet multiphonics.

Dr Sarah Watts teaches at Sheffield University in the capacity of **Performance Lead - Music at the University of Sheffield**.



Adults

What to Perform

- You may perform monologues, duologues, or verse/prose selections taken from published plays, recognised anthologies, published poetry collections, folktales, myths, short stories, or public-domain works (including those listed in the LAMDA or Trinity syllabuses).
- You may also use contemporary, classical, or original material.
- Verse or prose should be treated as performance text—delivered as a dramatic or narrative piece rather than a simple reading.
- New writing must be your own or created by a member of your performing group. If one performer wrote the piece, credit that person when introducing it and ensure you have their permission to use it. Collaborative devised work should list all contributors.

Advice to performers

- Time your piece carefully to stay within the limit.
- You must learn your lines as you will not have your script on stage
- KS2 and KS3 entrants may have a prompt seated close to the front of the audience (prompting should be discreet and only if necessary).
- You may enter, exit, and move freely during your piece, but keep movements within the performance area.
- Devised work may be stylised and may include physical theatre and low-risk movement.
- Full costumes aren't required, but you may wear them if you wish. Please note there is no changing allowed at the venue because of Child Performance Licensing and Safeguarding. You must arrive fully dressed in your costume, thank you.

- A table and chairs will be provided—no other stage furniture may be used.
- Props should be small, hand-held, and safe for stage use (no sharp objects, weapons, flames, or hazardous items).
- Performances will be under general lighting only.
- Music may only be used as part of a devised piece where it is an intentional stylistic choice (e.g. physical theatre) and may not be used in other categories. Where music is used entrants are responsible for this e.g. bringing a speaker and starting/ending it as this is not the responsibility of the festival organisers.
- Before you begin, introduce yourself, your piece, and the writer (or say “original work” for devised/new writing).
- Please freeze or hold a clear moment of stillness at the end of your performance so the finish is obvious.
- Keep things simple so the focus stays on your acting.

Information

Own Choice

Music performed in the Festival is your own choice (except the Gwendoline Lee prize class in piano). **Please remember to bring a copy of what you are playing on the day for the adjudicator.** Photocopies are acceptable but must be destroyed after the performance.

Awards

Awards will not be announced from the platform.

Programme

The programme will be published on the Festival website in February.

Shorten Cup

The Shorten Cup was given by the founder of the Festival and is awarded for instrumental chamber music to encourage small ensemble playing. The Cup will be awarded to a group as decided by an adjudicator. The instrumental class will be selected and announced when all Festival entries have been received.

FESTIVAL RULES

- 1 The object of the Festival is to raise the standard of amateur music making and acting by giving practitioners the opportunity to perform in public and under concert conditions. They benefit from professional feedback on their work and from the opportunity to hear their fellow performers. An amateur is someone who does not derive his/her living from the music profession.
- 2 **Entry fees cannot be returned as we book our venues based on the number of people who have registered to perform.**
- 3 **Copies of all performance material MUST be provided for the adjudicator. Photocopies are acceptable, providing they are destroyed immediately after the performance.**
- 4 **Parents can only take photos or videos of their child performing solo. No photography or videography of other children is allowed, including when your child is performing as part of a group with others.**
- 5 The Festival is open to residents of Norfolk and to such others as may be admitted by the Festival Committee.
- 6 **An official Festival photographer will be capturing images / video / audio which may be used on our website, on social media and in promotional material. Should parents or teachers not wish their participants included in any photographs, Press or video recording they should notify us in advance.**
- 7 No one may discuss any aspect of the Festival with an Adjudicator except at the invitation of the Adjudicator.
- 8 Festival entries should be made via our website by **30 Nov 2025**. All applications must be accompanied by the appropriate fee.
- 9 The Festival reserves the right to refuse entry without assigning any reason.
- 10 Entrants will perform only once in each class except for class PN33 (piano teacher and pupil duet) and in the woodwind classes if performing on different instruments.
- 11 Whilst every effort will be made to adhere to the advertised programme the Festival reserves the right to make modifications.
- 12 Pieces will be heard in full if played within the stated time limit.

- 13 Normally, participants will not be allowed to perform at any time other than that programmed for their class.
- 14 The winner of the previous year's Gwendoline Lee Memorial Prize is ineligible to enter this year.

All details will be published in the Festival Programme, which will be available on our website norfolkmusic.org.uk in February 2026.

CERTIFICATES AND ADJUDICATION

Norfolk County Music Festival is not an examination – the emphasis is on enjoyment and learning, therefore the adjudicators use their time to talk and to explain how you can improve your performance.

In classes where certificates are awarded we use the following grading system:

Outstanding Performance

Highly Commended

Commended Performance

The adjudicator may use his or her discretion to award a **Commended Plus** or a **Highly Commended Plus** where the performance merits this but is not *quite* the standard for the higher category. Feedback from adjudicators tells us that they appreciate this flexibility and they usually explain their decision making to entrants.
